The United Methodist Committee On Relief- UMCOR- is working with the Sudanese Lost Boys and Girls Volunteers Association, Inc. to raise funds for a project to provide safe drinking water to their community. Greetings to the People of People's United Methodist Church

As we start a new year together (which will be my last six months with you) there are a few things I would like to say and remind you of.

Let the scripture above be our vision and mission for the Year of 2012. What wonderful things happen when God in charge becomes the center of our lives. That is my prayer for each of us in the coming months

What a wonderful group of staff that minister on your behalf. We have spent a good deal of time working together to minister within the vision and mission of this church. I often remark to my wife Jean that this church is just plain spoiled. I think that is true and what a great thing it is. Take time to thank the staff of People's United Methodist.

Our committee and work team leaders are also a blessing. Every committee of this church and the people that serve of those committees just get better and better. Again take time to let "your petitions and praises shape your worried into prayers." Again take time to say "Thanks".

I am aware at July 1 approaches that grief is very much a part of my process. It surprised me some as I look forward to retirement and yet it brings an end to so much. I am also aware of that process for our church as well. So, here are some reminders of the stages of grief. This has been very helpful for me to remember. I hope and pray it helps.

Phases of the Change Process

Shock: Shock is a first reaction to a change projected that is announced to people. Sometimes this is not the initial reaction to an announced change but the entire cycle only starts when people realize what the change means to them personally. Example - "My God!"; "What?"

Denial: Denial is usually only a temporary defense for the individual. Example - "I feel fine."; "This can't be happening, not to me."

Anger: Once in the second stage, the individual recognizes that denial cannot continue. Feeling of frustration and anger often come to the surface. Example - "Why me? It's not fair!"; "How can this happen to me?"; "Who is to blame?"

Bargaining: The third stage involves the hope that the individual can somehow postpone, delay or neutralize the change, or to get an adequate compensation. Example - "What's in it for me?"; "What does that mean for my future?"; "What can I do?"

Depression: During the fourth stage, we begin to understand the certainty of change. Because of this, the individual may become silent, refuse dialogue and spend much among

peers who feel the same. It is an important time for grieving that must be processed. Example - "I'm sad, why bother?"; "What's the point?"; "This is happening, whether we want or not."

Acceptance: This final stage comes with peace and understanding of the change that is approaching. People buy-in and start to become pro-active again. Example - "It's going to be okay."; "I can't change it, I may as well prepare for it."

Happy New Year....those are my thoughts. An official translation of the scripture at the beginning of this says...

“Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

Dear Family and Friends,

God said, *It is not good for man to be alone* (Gen. 2:18), and so God created families! The celebrations of faith and family during Kwanza, Hanukkah, and Christmas are over, yet attention to family is just as important in January as it was in December. Since the family of the 1950's is no longer the norm, we as church need to ask what it means to be "family" and how to claim or perhaps, "reclaim" its importance.

Today's families are led by traditional parents, single parents, blended or step families, or by a group that is unrelated, such as church circles or close friends. Even though they may look different, each group is made of people who support and love each other in all of life's situations. Without family, people are often set adrift with no direction or support which tends to make them less healthy. Positive relationships provide unconditional love and encouragement which fosters self-esteem, positive attitudes, and better health habits. They ground a person and provide building blocks for other relationships.

How does one build and nurture positive families? Be interested in each other's activities. Attend and support each other's interests and events. Plan outings for the family and offer positive, bonding experiences. Listen to each other and learn to "agree to disagree" as families also need to understand and deal with conflict.

All families have highs and lows so it is important to teach children how to handle disappointment and adversity as well as how to celebrate the joys and wonders of family life. Embrace all family life whether it consists of biological, church, neighborhood, college, or other supportive "family". Each setting is important to our spiritual, mental and physical health.

Committee Minutes

Worship Team Meeting December 14, 2011

Saturday Evening Services (guidance for Council in making a decision)

Continue as is, discontinue, change format?

Discussion: discontinuing seems to make sense, but it seems disrespectful of attendees to do so without seeking their input. If there are some who cannot or will not attend Sunday morning service, their needs could be met either through changing Saturday service to a more cost-effective format, or providing worship opportunity at another time. This could be accomplished through using fourth-Thursday worship model and/or expanding it to a weekly service.

Follow-up: Jon, Mary & Barbara Feeny will communicate with Saturday night attendees to see if they would be able/willing to attend Sunday services and present that information to council along with the above options if necessary.

Fourth Thursday Worship

Mary expressed need for additional leaders

Options include publicizing the need for leadership

Keep discussion simple with easy preparation so folks don't feel as they have to be "experts" to lead

Build attendance & begin rotating leadership

Fill the 2 open slots on Worship Team with persons receptive to working on Thursday worship

Follow-up: Mary will lead January's discussion (with Jenny, if she wants to help). The future & direction of future gatherings is somewhat dependent on what happens with Sat. night service.

Council goals for 2012 (to be implemented by Worship Committee, Church Council & pastor)

Greater variety of services offered with defined styles of worship and music which results in more people attending and being involved

More meaningful, God-centered & vibrant worship

Growing & improving our music program
Discussion: It's clear who worship team, church council & pastor are, but not who would comprise a "Worship Committee". To assume these additional responsibilities will require a new job description. Worship Team responsibilities would remain same, but it would be part of a larger committee. This large committee would meet quarterly to coordinate/plan all elements of worship (similar to the Christmas planning meeting we had in October). Mary offered to draft a new description and email it for comments.



2012 Pledges

As of December 23rd, we have received 110 pledges to the General Fund totaling \$284,800. We anticipate receiving another \$9,000, however we need \$20,000 to \$30,000 to meet our proposed 2012 budget. Please prayerfully consider increasing your pledge, and contact the church office if you can do so. January is the season for New Year's resolutions. We want to start out the New Year on the "right foot," taking care to improve ourselves and our habits. Getting out of debt and saving money are generally two of the top ten resolutions made each year. Cuts in income seem to be the norm these days, so how do we remain faithful and generous as we set priorities in the New Year?

It seems counter-intuitive but it begins by giving. Generosity breeds a positive, "can-do" attitude in us. It's good to say thank you, even in tough times. Therefore as you make moves toward financial freedom from debt, consider:

Bible Quiz

In the book of Judges, a cycle is repeated many times: The Israelites do "what is evil in the sight of the LORD," God hands them over to an enemy nation, they cry out to the Lord and he appoints a judge, or political/military leader, for them.
